#### RULES OF GOVERNANCE

The formation of an organization is the manifestation of the liberty of the people to assemble peaceably as guaranteed in Article I of the *Bill of Rights* to the *Constitution of the United States*. This ability to legitimately organize exposes organizations to the practices expected in a representative democracy, and is representational of the idea that laws are to be understood and obeyed. Obedience to law within a group creates the ability to have procedural order and use parliamentary procedure to address organizational business in order to fulfill the organizational mission in a coherent manner.

At the very first meeting of the Nokomis Club on June 3, 1909, the charter members set out a set of rules for the club members. These written rules stated and regulated the behavioral expectations of the charter members according to the prevailing standards for organizations. As those standards have shifted and evolved, the club constitution reflects the revised standards applicable to members.

Subscription to a set of financial standards administered by the State of Washington began in 1933 when the Redmond Public Library incorporated with nonprofit status. This status was transferred to the Nokomis Club of Redmond, Washington in 1954, and continues to the present time.

### Laws and Bylaws

- 1. Only those of good moral character may become members of the club.
- 2. Two negatives bars any person from membership.
- 3. The dues are ten cents 10¢ per meeting.
- 4. The use of the funds to be for any purpose the majority of the members may decide.
- 5. A fine of fine dollars \$5 shall be imposed on any member, who creates a disturbance which in any way reflects upon the club, either with those who are or are not members of the club.
- 6. There shall be a meeting of the club once in every two weeks (2 wks). Thursday was set as the day.
- 7. A fine of five dollars shall be imposed on anyone who serves more than tea, cake, and fruit.
- 8. Terms of office shall not exceede one year.
- 9. The annitation fee shall be twenty-five cents (25¢).

#### Constitution and By-Laws

Art. 1 Name
Whis Club shall be called the Nokomis Club of Redmond, Wash.

#### Art. 2 Object

The object of the club is promotion of sociability, mutual and civic improvement.

#### Ant 3 Membership

Any woman of legal age and of good moral character, who is in sympath with our aims is eligible to membership.

#### Art 4 Officers

- Sec. 1 The officers of this club shall be a president, vicepresident, Secretary and Treasurer who shall serve for one year and or until their successors are elected and qualified.
- Sec. 2 There shall also be a library board consisting of four members who shall be elected one for 1 year, one for 2 gears; one for three years and one for four years and thereafter one member elected each year to serve for a four year term.

#### ArtSe5. 3Executive committee

The executive Board shall be composed of the elected officers including the Chairman of the Library Board.

#### Art. 6 Annual meeting.

The April meeting shall be for the election of officers and reading of the annual reports, and the May meeting Shall be for the inshallation of officers.

#### Art. 7 Ammendment

This constitution may be ammended by a 3/4 vote of those present, at any regular meeting, provided notice of such ammendment shall have been given in writing at the previous regular meeting.

#### Form of By-Laws

#### Article 1

#### Duties of Officers

- Sec. The President shall preside at all the meetings of the Club and of the Executive Board, and shall appoint all committees.
- Sec. 2 A. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall perform the duties of that office.
- Sec. 2 B In the absence of both the President and Vice President the Secretary shall perform the duties of the presiding office and appoint a secretary.
- Soc. 3 The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and of the Executive Board, and shall perform such other duties as the Club may direct. She shall also read the By-Laws three times during the year.
- Sec. 4 The Treasurer shall take care of the funds of the Club, which shall be deposited in the bank, and she shall keep an itemized account of all receipts and expenditures by order of the Club.

#### Article 2

#### Membership

- Sec. 1 A The name of an applicant for membership shall be presented in writing to the Club and endorsed by two members, and accompanied by 50¢ initiation fee.
- Sec. 2 Candidates shall be voted upon by ballot. Two negatives reject.
- $S_{\rm e}c$ . 3 Candidates shall be notified in writing by the Secretary-if accepted or rejected.
- Sec. 4 Any member wishing to withdraw her membership shall state the same in writing to the Club.
- Sec. 5 No member shall be dropped from the Club except upon her request because of moving from the community.

#### Article 3

#### Dues

- Sec. 1 The dues shall be 3.00 per year, payable in June.
- Sec. 2 Any member who is in arrears 3 months shall be notified in writing by the Secretary.
- Sec. 2 B If dues are not paid in 6 months their name will be arounded automatically dropped.

#### Article 4

#### Meetings .

- Sec. 1 The regular meetings of the Club shall be held the last Friday of each month at 12-30 P. M.
- Sec. 2 Special meeting of the Club may be called by the Executive Board by notifying each member.

- Sec. 1 Election of officers shall be by ballot at the annual meeting.
- Sec. No person shall be eligible to the office of President for more than 2 consecutive terms.

#### Article 6

#### Committees

- Sec. 1 A committee of three shalls be appointed by the President at the annual meeting to prepare a program for the ensuing year with the Vice-Presidne as Chairman.
- Sec. 2 A A nominating Committee of the three shall be appointed at the March meeting to suggest the names for each office.

## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS (revised Edition)

- Article 1: NAME
  This Club shall be called the NOKOMIS CLUB OF REDMOND, WASH.
- Article 2: OBJECT
  The object of the Club is promotion of sociability, mutual and civic improvement.
- Article 3: MEMBERSHIP
  Any Women of legal age and of good moral character, who is in sympathy with our aims is eligible to membership.
- Article 4: OFFICERS

  The officers of this club shall be president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer, who shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.
- Article 5: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

  The execytuve board shall be compose of the elected officers;
- Article 6: ANNUAL MEETING

  The April meeting shall be for the election of officers and reading of the annual reports. The May meeting shall be for the installation of officers.
- Article 7: AMENDMENT

  This Constitution may be amended by a three quarter vote of those present at any regular meeting, provided notice of such amendment shall have been given to each by telephone.

#### FORM OF BY-LAWS

- Article 1: DUTY OF OFFICERS

  Sec: 1 The President shall preside at all the meeting of the Club and the Executive Board, and shall appoint all Committees.
  - Sec. 2: In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall perform the duties of that office.
  - Sec. 3: In the absence of both the President and Vice-President, The Secretary shall perform the duties of the President (presiding office) and appoint a Secretary.
  - Sec. 4: The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meeting of the Club and of the Executive Board, and shall perform such other duties as the club may direct. She shall also read the By-Laws three times during the year.
  - Sec. 5: The Treasurer shall take care of the funds of the Club which shall be deposited in the bank, and she shall keep an itimized account of all receipts and expenditures by corder of the Club

#### Article 2: MEMBERSHIP

- Sec. 1: The name of an Applicant for membership shall be presented in writing to the Club and endorsed by 1 Member. There will be a 50¢ Initiation fee.
- Sec. 2. Any Member wishing to withdraw her membership shall state the same in writing to the Club.

#### Article 3: DUES

- Sec. 1: The dues shall be \$5.00 per year payable in September.
- Sec. 2: Any Member who is in arrears three months shall be notified in writing by the treasurer.
- Sec. 3: If dues are not paid in six months her name will be automatically dropped.
- Sec. 4: A Member having been a member 50 years (fifty years) shall not be required to pay dues.

#### Article 4: MEETINGS

- Sec. 1: The regular meetings of the Club shall be held the last Friday of each month at 12:00 P.M. except on special occasions.
- Sec. 2: Special meetings of the Club may be called by the Execitive Board by notifing each Member.

#### Article 5: ELECTIONS

- Sec. 1: Election of Officers shall be by ballot at the annual meeting or the Secretary shll cast an unanimous ballot.
- Sec. 2: No person shall be eligible to the office of President for more than two consecutive terms.

#### Article 6: COMMITTEES

- Sec. 1: A committee of three shall be appointed by the President at the annual meeting to prepare a program for the ensuing year with the Vice-President as chairman.
- Sec. 2: A nominating committee of three shall be appointed at the March meeting to suggest names for each office. Nominations may also be made from the floor.

#### Article 7:

Sec. 1: The rules contained in the Nokomis Club shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.
